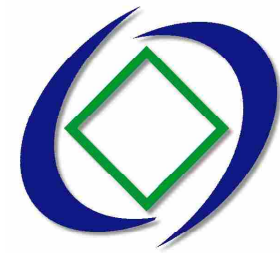

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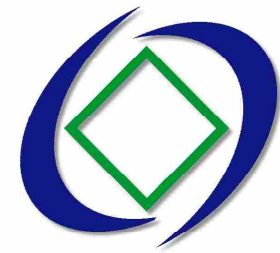
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VII. International Training Seminar for Positive Psychotherapy successfully completed in Wiesbaden in August 2006

Wiesbaden Academy (WIAP) has moved to bigger venue and opens up a large polyclinic

Wiesbaden Academy for Psychotherapy (WIAP) – which also hosts the head office of the International Center for Positive Psychotherapy (ICPP) – has moved to a bigger venue. This change of location had become necessary due to constantly increasing numbers of candidates and patients. The new academy facilities have 7 seminars rooms, a big

lecture hall for an audience of 100 people, various rooms for the administrative staff and 13 rooms for treatment of clients. In this course, the status of the therapeutic ambulance has changed to become a polyclinic where currently 150 clients are directly treated and another 350 clients' treatments are supervised and coordinated. The president of the German Psychotherapy Chamber ("Bundespsychotherapeutenkammer"), Rainer Richter, was one of the speakers at the opening ceremony of the polyclinic. 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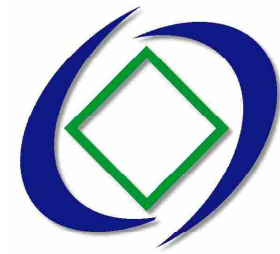
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Reports from the Centers and International Teaching Activities

In 2006, a national summer conference took place in Sofia for five days (organised by Milena Manova). At present about 12 training groups are running throughout the country. Ivanka Boncheva has finished her State Doctorate/Dissertation (“psychological parameters of the communication medical doctor – patient” including the five stages model of Positive Psychotherapy) and is now professor for clinical psychology focussing on Positive Psychotherapy. Prof. Todorov as the former chair of psychiatric university clinic the whole activity of Positive Psychotherapy since 1982 and became a honorary professor of ICPP. Iliia Peev has also received his State Doctorate and teaches Positive Psychotherapy at the Free University of Varna and at the Marine Academy in Varna. He published “Positive Psychotherapy in the modern army and the society” in 2002. 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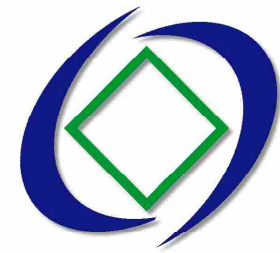

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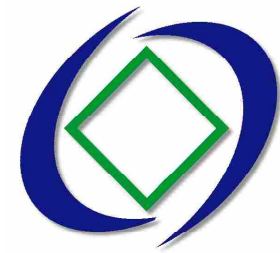
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Portugal

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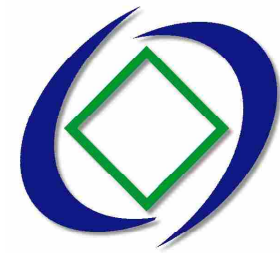

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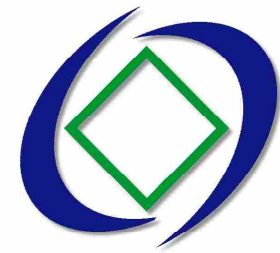
